

The Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources (AFNR) Career Cluster focuses on the essential elements of life food, water, land, and air. This career cluster includes a diverse spectrum of occupations, ranging from farmer, rancher, and veterinarian to geologist, land conservationist, and florist. It also includes non-traditional agricultural occupations like wind energy, solar energy, and oil and gas production.

Agribusiness Statewide Program of Study





The Agribusiness program of study explores the occupations and educational opportunities associated with the business of farming and agriculturally related business that supplies farm inputs, such as machinery and seeds. This program of study may also include exploration into the marketing of farm products, the purchase of farm products either for further processing or resale and grading or classifying unprocessed food or other agricultural products.

Nursing



- Courses correlated with PJC.
- Students complete Enhanced Nurse Aid Certificate 1 at PJC
- Students have the opportunity (paid by Red River Promise) to complete Phlebotomy Certificate.
- Students complete the CNA or PCT certificate prior to graduation.
- Clarksville ISD partners with Paris Regional Health for career placement.
- Students complete Summer Bridge programs.

Welding



- Courses correlated with PJC.
- Students complete Structural Steel Welding Certificate at PJC.
- Students have the opportunity (paid by Red River Promise) to complete additional certificates and A.A.S. in Welding Technology.
- Students complete the AWS or NCCER certificate prior to graduation.
- Clarksville ISD partners with Turner Industries for career placement.
- Students complete Summer Bridge programs.

Concern #1

Number of Students by Grade Level



• Example:

- 48 students enrolled in the freshmen class 2023-2024 school year.
- 2 programs of study offered by Clarksville ISD, welding & nursing.
- Paris Junior College requires minimum of 10 students enrolled to "make" a course.
- A minimum of 20 students are required to enroll in welding & nursing.
- -20/48 = 41.7% enrollment in CTE.
- An additional CTE program is added, 30/48 = 62.5%
- An additional 2 CTE programs are added, 40/48 = 83.3%
- Is 4 CTE programs feasible?

Potential Solution #1


Number of Students by Grade Level




Example:

- 48 students enrolled in the freshmen class 2023-2024 school year.
- 42 students enrolled in the sophomore class 2023-2024 school year.
- Combine the two school years for enrollment numbers at PJC.
- 2 programs of study offered by Clarksville ISD, welding & nursing.
- Paris Junior College requires minimum of 10 students enrolled to "make" a course.
- A minimum of 20 students are required to enroll in welding & nursing.
- -20/90 = 22.2% enrollment in CTE.
- An additional CTE program is added, 30/90 = 33.3%
- An additional 2 CTE programs are added, 40/90 = 44.4%

Concern #3 Class Offerings



- Medical Terminology I & Principles of Health Science must be completed by current Freshmen & Sophomores by the end of 2023-2024 school year.
- Principles of Health Science is a prerequisite.
- Medical Terminology is a correlated course thus the instructor must either be credentialed by PJC or an acceptable online solution must be completed.
- Introduction to Welding must be completed by current Freshmen &
 Sophomores by the end of 2023-2024 school year.
- Keeth Tyson must be credentialled by Paris Junior College.

- Nursing students learned about blood types, medical equipment and even mastered roman numerals!
